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### **ENROLMENT PLANS AND CLASS PLACEMENT FOR 2016**

The demand for places at Moonee Ponds West continues to be very high. 2016 Prep Applications closed on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> August 2015. A reminder for families already at the school, you are required to put in an enrolment form for younger brothers/sisters as soon as possible if you have not already done so. All enrolments for Prep 2016 will be confirmed in writing on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2015. If you are leaving the school during Term 4 or at the end of 2015 please let the office know at your earliest convenience. This will greatly assist our forward planning and also the transition of those students leaving at the end of the year into their new schools.

If you have some information that your child's teacher is **unaware** of that may assist with your child's class placement please put your comments in writing and forward them to Jeff Lyon by Friday 30<sup>th</sup> October. This request will then be registered for consideration.

#### JAPANESE AT MPW

Last week was a big one for MPW and our Japanese Program. On the 4 August we hosted 5 educators from Osaka. They came from the pre-school, primary and secondary school sectors. As well as touring the school they spent the majority of the day in the Japanese classroom. As well as observing the teaching and learning they took part in running various whole class activities with our students. The group enjoyed their visit to MPW very much. # PRODUCTION OF TEACHER TRAINING MATERIALS FOR THE BUILDING RESILIENCE SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING TEACHER TRAINING RESOURCES PROJECT

A joint project between VicHealth and The University of Melbourne, Graduate School of Education



The University of Melbourne's Graduate School of Education (**University**) is working with the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation (**VicHealth**) to design teacher-training materials for the *Building Resilience Social and Emotional Learning Teacher Training Resources Project* (**Project**). The Project looks at important issues like <u>decision-making</u>, <u>problem-solving</u>, <u>stress management</u>, and <u>peer support</u>. The Project is designed to support development of key skills that students require to lead balanced and happy lives.

On **Friday 7<sup>th</sup> August** the students in **Room 16** took part in this project. The film crew and staff from the project worked on resilience activities and social emotional learning; teaching new skills and interviewing students. The completed version will be available early next term and available to all teachers to help assist in the teaching of social emotional skills.
